Findon Sheep Fair 2026 - Nepcote Green

This year's Sheep Fair will take place across the weekend 11th to 13th Sept

- **Friday 11th Evening - Barn Dance in the Marquee 19:00 to 23:00 ***
 - **Saturday 12th Daytime - Main Sheep Fair on the Green 10:00 to 16:30**
 - **Saturday 12th Evening - Party on the Green in the Marquee 19:00 to 23:00 ****
 - **Sunday 13th Daytime - Salvation Army Songs of Praise Service 14:45**
- (* admission by ticket, and at the door if not all tickets sold. ** admission by ticket only)

The Saturday daytime event is free to enter and includes a Funfair, Sheep Judging, Camels, Birds of Prey, Morris Dancing, Food Stalls, Beer Tent, Mobile Belfry, Face Painting, Country Crafts, Archery, Stalls and many more attractions.

Car Parking is available in adjacent fields at a cost of £6 per car. In order to ease traffic congestion during the daytime event we will once again be operating a one way system through the village. This will be signposted and marshalled and will run from 7am to 5pm. We are grateful for the patience and

consideration given by villagers in keeping traffic congestion to a minimum. We are especially grateful for those who have revised shopping and other delivery plans to alternative days to avoid the sheep fair day and reduce the potential for traffic disruption.

We would like to thank our sponsors, volunteers and the Findon Valley Scouts for their support that allows the event to run. If there are any concerns or feedback you would like to provide to the sheep fair team, please contact us via email at admin@findonsheepfair.org.uk

During the event, a duty officer will be available at the end of main marquee to answer any questions. If you have any immediate concern please pop along and notify us of this.

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News from the Rectory

Writing this in August with a fifth heat wave on the way, I wonder how long the hot, dry summer will last. Will we have rain in autumn? This year the meteorological start of autumn is the 1st of September and on September the 23rd the autumnal equinox brings equal lengths of night and day. It is hard to imagine a “season of mists and mellow fruitfulness” described by John Keats in his poem, “To Autumn” Keats later depicts the blessing of harvest foods to store. Although the harvesting of crops is sometimes later in the year or as this year much earlier, autumn is a time of year to give thanks for all that we receive. The churches in our parish each have a harvest festival, both Findon and Patching on the 6th September and Clapham on the 20th.

I recall as a child we made up small boxes of fruit and vegetables which we took to church and laid at the altar. These gifts were then taken to elderly people in the community. Today harvest service gatherings provide community support differently. Donations include non-perishable goods that can be given to centres that cater for homeless people such as Turning Tides or community pantries, a number of which are located in Angmering and Littlehampton. At Patching church, the gifts of home produced or purchased fruit, vegetables, cakes, breads, preserves, groceries and more are auctioned, raising funds for a local charity. This year the beneficiary will

be St Barnabas Hospice. You are welcome to join the harvest auction at Patching church on 6th September at 11.15am, following the 10am harvest service. The event is always good fun.

There are many types of supportive communities, faith groups, youth organisations, special interest groups, neighbourhood communities and many more; as time goes on new communities develop and some disappear. I recall post war life in a northern industrial town. There was very little motor traffic so children played in the streets, whip and top, skipping, marbles, hopscotch and rounders, using the street lamps on the four corners of crossroads as bases. Games were rarely paused for ‘traffic’. Occasionally a car came by or the ‘rag and bone’ man with his horse drawn cart, shouting unintelligibly. Recognised by occupants they bought out items that nowadays would be taken to a charity shop or an amenity tip. Such communities dispersed as people were moved to better housing, often in tower blocks.

I was interested recently to read that in Leeds residents who fulfil certain requirements can close their streets for periods and allow children to play there. It seems a good way to build neighbourhood communities that have been adversely affected by rehousing, moving for work and latterly the isolation of covid and that of social media, where at times those that are isolated can experience harmful approaches.

Our weekly classes, village groups and monthly activities are back in full swing in September after the summer break, so don't wait for a New Years resolution have a look at what's on offer - try out a new activity at the hall now.

On September 4th at 7pm the Parish Council are holding a screening of the National Emergency Briefing on the climate and nature crisis. The film is intended as a catalyst for a wider public conversation and a stepping stone towards a live televised national briefing, introduced by the Prime Minister and delivered by independent experts, so that the whole country can be fully informed about the risks we face and the solutions available. 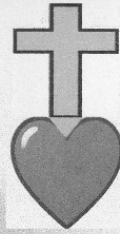

Roads & Parking Update

The Community Highways Scheme (CHS) application for School Hill - proposing a one-way traffic system - was submitted at the end of July for consideration by WSCC Highways. Shortly afterwards, new road markings appeared on School Hill. Many residents

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were surprised by their arrival, and feedback has been clear: the positioning of the markings means they are not easily visible to drivers and may not be effective in managing the traffic-safety issues experienced on this narrow stretch of road. The Parish Council has noted these concerns and will continue to monitor the situation while awaiting the outcome of the CHS application.

Nepcote Speeding & Rat Run Concerns

At the last Parish Council meeting, residents raised concerns about speeding and rat-run traffic along Nepcote.

Residents reported incidents of anti-social driving and verge damage.

The Roads & Parking Group is now looking into what can be done to improve safety along Nepcote. As with all Highways matters, evidence is essential. To demonstrate to WSCC Highways that there is a genuine and ongoing problem, we urgently need residents to keep a record of incidents.

What residents can do

Please make a log of any:

Speeding incidents

Anti-social driving

Damage to vehicles

Damage to verges or property

This evidence is vital. WSCC will only **consider interventions — signage, engineering changes, or enforcement measures — when there is a clear record showing that a problem exists.**

UK Wildfires & Local Risk

The Met Office reports that the recent heatwaves may continue into September, keeping conditions unusually dry across southern England. With prolonged high temperatures and very low ground moisture, wildfire risk

remains a concern for many of us here in Findon.

Local landowners have already taken precautions: some grassed fields around the village have been left uncut because machinery striking a flint could create a spark. Leaving the grass uncut may seem hazardous, however in these conditions it is actually the safer option. Cutting dry grass increases the chance of machinery hitting flints, creating sparks, and igniting vegetation.

Safety Advice

Residents are asked to continue following current fire-safety guidance:

No BBQs anywhere on the Downs or surrounding fields

No bonfires until conditions improve

Take care with machinery that could create sparks

Do not discard cigarettes

Do not discard vapes or items containing batteries that could overheat and cause fire

Do not discard glass bottles

Report suspected fires immediately by calling 999 and asking for the Fire Brigade

With the ground still tinder-dry, even a small ignition can spread quickly.

Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) – Call for Ideas

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Findon Open Spaces Volunteer Group

If you happen to be out in the Village on Wednesday mornings, you may have seen a strange looking group of men wearing hi vis jackets, carrying spades or rakes; perhaps even looking down one of the many drains. Well if so, that's us, the Open Spaces group also known as the Chain Gang. We volunteer every Wednesday, from 9am till 11am and we've recently celebrated ten years of active service in the Village.

There's generally around seven or eight of us each week, but some weeks we get 12 or 13 of us. There's a great camaraderie within the group with a good mixture of work, rest and banter amongst the group. We always finish off with coffee and cakes (or homemade sausage rolls if we're lucky!).

We will carry out pretty much anything that needs doing in relation to the

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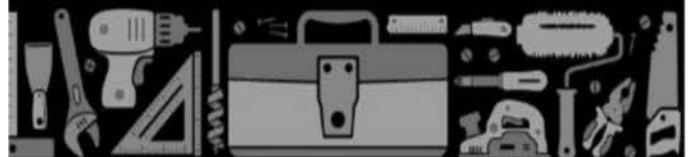


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Paws Animal Sanctuary

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The Dream of Gerontius

cert, Mendelssohn's 'Elijah', Arun Choral Society will perform Edward Elgar's 'The Dream of Gerontius' under the direction of Dr Joe Paxton in the stunning surroundings of Arundel Cathedral on Sunday 25th October at 7.30pm.

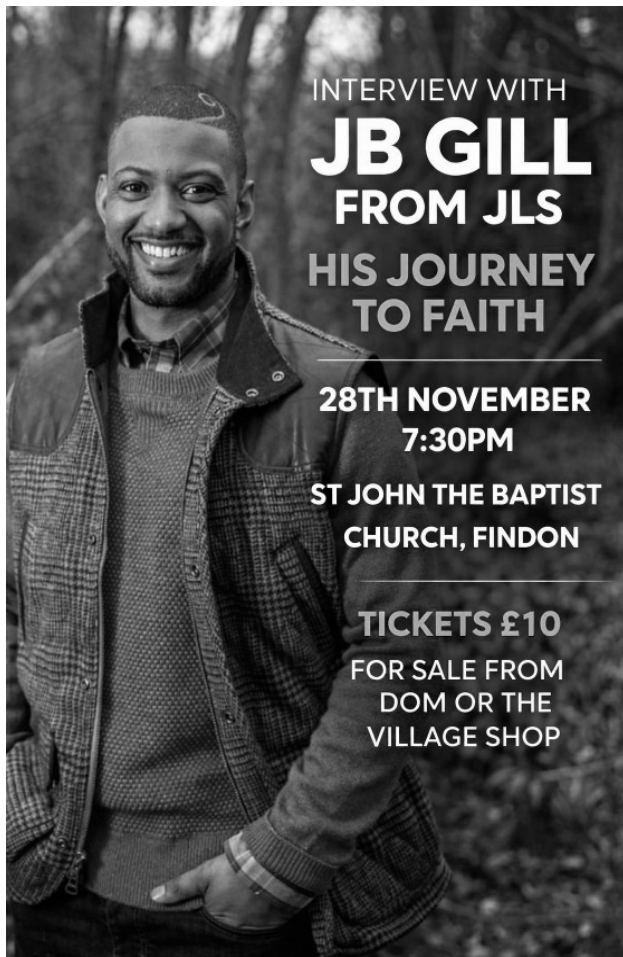
The piece is widely regarded as Elgar's finest choral work, indeed considered by some to be his masterpiece. Many will be familiar with the work following its fictitious 1916 performance by the Ramsden Choral Society in the 2025 film 'The Choral'.

In 1865 Cardinal Newman wrote a poem 'The Dream of Gerontius' dealing with the questions about afterlife and God. Elgar's chance to set Gerontius to music came

at the age of forty-two with a commission for the 1900 Birmingham Triennial Festival.

The Dream of Gerontius followed hard on the heels of the Enigma Variations, Elgar's first major success. However, the fate of the Dream's premiere did not go so well. Inadequate rehearsal, lacklustre soloists, an overworked chorus and the sudden death of their choirmaster, along with little sympathy for a Catholic text or experience of such demanding writing, saw to it that the performance was deemed an outright failure that led a furious Elgar to comment, "I have worked for forty years and, at the end,

This concert will be a wonderful experience for everyone.’
