## From the Rectory

The days are longer and the sun finally has some warmth in it as we begin April with the final week of Lent and Holy Week. The Joy of Easter as we celebrate Christ's victory over death and his glorious resurrection becomes much more powerful when we also share something of what he suffered in those final days of his earthly life. Palm Sunday, April 13th signals the start of what the church calls Holy Week, culminating with an empty tomb and Jesus risen on Easter Sunday. These two Sundays are joyful, unlike the days between them!

Firstly, we remember how the crowds welcomed Jesus as he and his disciples approached Jerusalem for the Jewish Passover, waving palm branches and cheering as Jesus rode past on a donkey. How quickly a happy crowd can turn into a jeering angry mob! When Jesus entered the Temple grounds in Jerusalem, he turned over tables, upsetting stallholders who were making money charging too much for offerings for sacrifice, accusing them of turning God's house into a robbers' den. We read in the Gospels how Jesus celebrated the Passover with his disciples, firstly washing their feet to demonstrate loving service, then instituting what we now know as Holy Communion as he blessed, broke and shared bread (his body) and a cup of wine (his blood), asking his followers to "Do this in remembrance of me."

We read how Judas, one of the 12. agreed to betray Jesus to the authorities, leading to Jesus' arrest in the Garden of Gethsemane. The crowds who had recently welcomed the Son of David were quick to shout for his crucifixion at his trial. Jesus, innocent, dies on a cross, a thief on either side suffering the same fate. His body is laid in a tomb, but on the third day, the tomb is empty and Jesus is risen; Easter morning, the greatest Celebration of the Christian year. This year, we will celebrate this first at 6.00am at the top of Nepcote Lane, on Cissbury. All are welcome! Later risers can join us at later Services in our churches ending with Easter egg hunts.

But, only experiencing the joy of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday leaves a gap... Do try to join us for something else in the week between as we remember all Jesus has done for us in his Passion, death and resurrection. Stations of the Cross (Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday) encourage us to walk with Jesus to the cross; Maundy Thursday is an opportunity to watch and wait with him in prayer. On Good Friday, after 'Messy' crafts at the Rectory, we walk down the hill to Pond Green with the cross, remembering that Jesus died to free us all from sin and death. The churches are open for private prayer daily and Service times are on our

## **Findon Parish Council Report**

Findon Parish Council (FPC) would like to pay their respects to our former Council Chairman Peter Goldsworthy, who recently passed away. Our thoughts go to his wife Anne and family. Peter was Chair from 2005 to 2017 successfully navigating FPC through multiple challenges. Perhaps the most far-reaching was his vision and drive to harness the village in saving Findon Store and Post Office, generating the funds, purchasing the business through the route of a village cooperative creating Findon Village Store, now an established fixture which we can all be part of commercially and socially, a genuine hub to our village.

Notwithstanding the shop, Peter's legacy is significant - securing Nepcote Green, improving village drainage to avoid the torrent that flowed down Nepcote Lane at times, managing speed limits throughout the village, and repairs to the Wattle House which now sits proudly in a Conservation Area, all are due our thanks.

The latest revision to The Highway Code gives greater weight to the needs of pedestrians and cyclists. With this change in mind FPC will be making an application to West Sussex County Council (WSCC) Highways to amend the speed limit to 20mph on Nepcote Lane extending to Cissbury. That route is extensively used by walkers, cyclists and horse riders and such a change would conform with the rest of the village speed limits.

As a reminder, reporting potholes on our village roads can be undertaken using the online form from WSCC which can be found at Report a pothole online -

West Sussex County Council. The system is easy to use and more reporting can support swifter resolution.

FPC is looking to move some of the collected earth spoil at the village Allotment Gardens, with a view to creating a further two plots in the allotment footprint. Our waiting list for plots warrants the expenditure and although FPC recently voted to raise the annual plot rental cost, it is markedly lower than other nearby facilities.

The date is being finalised for June 2025 to host a Question and Answer session with our Member of Parliament Dr Beccy Cooper. This will likely be held in Findon Village Hall and the specific date will be advertised - we hope many parishioners will be able to attend. Questions in advance can be submitted to FPC, where they will be collated and provided ahead of the event to Dr Cooper, to prompt fuller answers and discussion. If it were not for Peter's vision, Findon may well be very different today from the bustling, thriving, friendly village it is. When the shop unexpectedly closed in 2017, it was Peter who, within days, called a public meeting, and mobilised everyone to raise sufficient funds. through a share-ownership scheme, to buy the shop. I only met Peter a couple of times (being a newbie), but what stood out to me was his determination, passion, and commitment; his tireless energy; his willingness to fight for what he believed; and, then, after the initial success, to carry on fighting to ensure the shop's future. A true pioneer!

And his legacy? Well, that the shop, at the heart of the community, is thriving, says it all. During the months when there was no shop, apparently Findon was subdued. Businesses reported that their takings were down, visitor numbers reduced, it was just – well, quiet. Hard to believe now. The shop really does bring people here, and keeps them here.

So, to the future. In memory of Peter, you could consider buying a share in the shop, or gifting any shares you already own. As I vividly recall Peter saying, the shop is secure now, but if folk need to withdraw their share(s) for one reason or another, we need the next generation on board. If you're

interested, please speak to Angus or Helen in the shop.

And now, down to more mundane matters. I've spent a long time thinking about the best way to alert you to this whilst making it sound less bad than it is. Do I say/write it quickly? Do I whisper it or write in greyed out script? How do I say something but not say it? But I want you to know it ... No, with gritted teeth, I'm resolved to bite the bullet, and just write it, and you can take it how you like. The price of stamps is going up. 

# **Paws Animal Sanctuary**

We have a lovely female cat, four years old, needing a home, her name is Bounty and she is up to date with her inoculations, flea and worm treatment, and is microchipped. She needs a safe garden. She has so much energy, she is in a pen with a long outside run and she does zoomies up and down all day, throwing her toys in the air. She arrived with her Mother but they didn't get on together so she needs to be the only cat.

Although we don't board animals, we constantly have requests to take in animals whose owners are in hospital or have died. We recently took in three traumatised cats belonging to an elderly lady who was ill for a long time. When she died the family asked us to find them new homes. At first none of the cats would eat. They would hide and it has taken months for them to trust us. One still hides all day and only eats when no one is around. We sit with her and she is slowly learning to trust us.

Another Cat arrived with such bad diarrhoea we were constantly cleaning her pen, bed and litter tray. Our Vet tried everything; she had injections, went on to a drip because she was so dehydrated. We tried probiotics and so many types of food, all of which meant she couldn't go to a new home. Finally, one of our volunteers recommended a new food that had cured her cat (that had the same problem). We have tried so many different brands of food, so we went ahead and ordered some, (although sceptical). But this week has been a miracle. The cat has only been fed on the new food at every meal, and at last the diarrhoea has gone! Poor little cat has really suffered. She is so happy now, purring when we go in her pen to see her.

Jasper our donkey was limping. The Vet came out and he is on Bute twice a day. We hide it inside an apple because he tips his bucket upside down if he smells it in his food. To give him a wormer we have to put it in a banana sandwich because he doesn't trust the applicator in our hand.

At last we can look forward to some better weather. With the constant rain we had so much mud in the paddock, the donkey and pony loved to roll in the mud every day, We had a lorry load of woodchip delivered and it has solved the mud problem.

I would also like to thank our ladies who run the subgroups, and of course Gill Gostick and Gay Hibbs who adorn the post box with their magnificent creations.


Our members decided to vote me in for a 'third term' as president, so you have me for another year!


