Following our meeting in July we are now planning for Light Lunch to continue in 2025 on the last Tuesday of the month. There will be another meeting held later in the year but if you



Village Hall News

Well, the first thing I should do this month is correct my "fat finger" error last month! Chanctonbury Hall will be closed for repairs to the floor for the week commencing the 19th August NOT the 29th as stated in my report last month... Nepcote will, of course, be open as usual.

We are delighted to say that the response to our "Light Lunches" appeal was very encouraging and we are really pretty confident that we will be able to maintain the activity as a "break even" rather than a fundraising event (like our winter "Tea and Biscuits" sessions) from the New Year – so there will be no interruption to the service!

We were also very pleased with the Summer fete we held recently, attendance was very good, the weather was kind (though it had us worried early on!), everyone seemed to have a good time and we raised a good deal of money.

We think that we now have solutions both for the Chanctonbury toilet floors and the hall-to-hall sound transmission issues. The toilets will be done one at a time to avoid the need to close the hall while the work is ongoing. The sound proofing will be addressed in 2 stages: firstly a significant upgrade to the partition wall on the Nepcote side followed by reinstalling the existing interconnecting door so that it is flush with the modified wall surface plus

inserting an additional, similar, door on the Chanctonbury side of the same doorway – so there will be two doors in series, like is found in interconnecting doors between hotel rooms. Neither of these sound insulation actions will require hall closures – just synchronised timing! There is still the possibility that work will also have to be undertaken in the roof space but this can't be realistically assessed until we have address the direct transmission paths.

The first of the new heating controllers has been fitted in Chanctonbury, and we hope to get it talking to the Hallmaster Booking software within the next week or so. Nepcote will be slightly more fiddly, but we will complete that as soon as we are happy with Chanctonbury.

During the recent election, Nepcote was used as the village polling station and we were surprised at how many people commented that they were surprised that it was there, that it was the first time they had seen it – and how nice it is! So – it's around 8x8 metres, has a sound system (thank you to the Village Shop for their kind donation) and a kitchen with hob, microwave, dishwasher etc and it is there for you to use!

We are also pleased that we have an extra activity for younger people in the hall these days – a modern dance class run by UdanceUK from 16:30 to 18:30 on Wednesdays.

We are still looking at improvements to hall access by integrating the door locks with the Hallmaster booking system – but this is likely to have to wait as the toilets and soundproofing together will make a Big Dent in our funds and probably drop us into the zone where we are operating with just enough cash to satisfy the statutory "rainy day" level of funding that we must maintain. Investment levels have been high since Nepcote opened and we cannot maintain that indefinitely. We must also consider the resurfacing of the car park – which will be a major expense.



Findon Parish Council News

Firstly, Findon Parish Council (FPC) would like to extend its thanks to Linda Martin who stood down as Council Chair on 28 June 2024. As the Deputy Chair of FPC, I will discharge the responsibilities of the Chair until our Full council Meeting on 29 July 2024, when the council will debate next steps.

Linda joined FPC in December 2018 and thereafter became chair of the Planning committee from October 2022, subsequently becoming chair of the Full council in May 2023. These roles amply demonstrate both the time and commitment given by Linda to FPC, qualities that will be sorely missed. At the time of writing, FPC has vacancies for three councillors – please contact our Clerk, Fiona MacLeod at

clerk@findonparishcouncil.gov.uk or 01903 877225 for more information. Many of us would have noted with a heavy heart the recent traveller incursion onto the north verge of Nepcote and the unfortunate ensuing damage. This was doubly frustrating, since FPC had purchased and was expecting delivery of more robust and secure fencing before the summer but manufacturing delay meant that it will now be installed after the event.

Following letters and calls by residents as well as a formal letter from FPC to the Sussex Police and Crime Commissioner Katy Bourne, the travellers departed after 12 days. A letter of thanks has been sent to the office of the Police and Crime Commissioner. The reporting of the incursion to Sussex Police was covered in our last piece by Linda but I would add that letters by residents do count and increasing "the voice" of the village undoubtedly creates a pressure for action with those relevant authorities.

A fantastic response from volunteers and the FPC working party saw the verge cleared, rubbish collected and binned within less than 24 hours and the area fenced off including a temporary barrier, to prevent further incursion. An external contractor duly collected all material and is in the process of sanitizing the area.

The dismantling of the old fencing and replacement by the already purchased more robust fencing as well as further long term solution, whilst avoiding any damage to our village assets in the conservation area around Nepcote Green is planned. FPC thanks those residents who have written to FPC with their thoughts and would encourage any residents to do likewise if they are concerned, since this creates an evidence base of village opinion and assists FPC in any actions it may take.

Dialogue has been extensive in partnership with South Downs National Park Authority, with FPC making it clear to SDNPA that swift and cooperative action is required to assuage village concerns. In the interim a soil drop has been arranged to bar entry to the North Verge, preventing further ingress.

Findon's Dogs - a polite request

There are many dogs in Findon, most of them well-behaved and delightful, but there have been a number of incidents over recent months of over-enthusiastic dogs pestering other dogs; causing distress to both dog and owner. The police and dog warden will not deal with these incidents, so it might be worth reminding ourselves of good "doggie etiquette".

I often hear "he/she only wants to play" when an unknown, unmanaged or overfriendly dog comes bounding up to my on-lead dog. It's not that my dog is unfriendly, but when an unknown animal runs up to her, bouncing and sniffing around and refusing to leave her alone, it can be extremely distressing. There may not be any physical injury involved, but an incident like that may make any dog more nervous than it already is.

Please remember that an on-lead dog cannot play, so if you see someone with a dog on a lead, please don't allow your dog to run up to them, expecting to play. Dogs are usually on their lead for a reason, sometimes for training purposes and sometimes because they are nervous or injured. There are many rescued or adopted dogs n the village and these may be especially vulnerable. All of these dogs should be allowed to stay calm and enjoy their walk.

So if you are walking your dog off the lead, please ensure you always have sight of where they are; are paying attention to what they are doing; and never let your dog run up to a dog that is being walked on the lead, regardless of how friendly you believe your dog to be.

If you are approaching an on-lead dog, the safest and politest thing to do is to put your own dog on a lead. And don't forget that your enthusiastic dog will be frustrated by an on-lead dog too, due to the other dog's unwillingness and/or inability to play. So it's best for all if the situation is avoided.

Similarly, long lines are a useful tool in dog training. However, a long line that does not have a human attached to the other end is worse than useless – it is dangerous. An excited dog can run around someone very quickly; winding the long line around their legs and causing a considerable hazard.

We all love our dogs, and they enrich our lives, but please let's not forget to be considerate towards other people's dogs too.



Paws Animal Sanctuary

There must be some kind of communication among hens, every day I collect the eggs, then suddenly each hen stopped laying - for two weeks no eggs. Today there were four eggs. It's weird, did they have a discussion?

Costa our Mobile Vet from Vets Care Vets spent most of the day here today inoculating all the recent arrivals. Also giving all the other cats check-ups, including a pregnant cat from London who arrived at 8.30 pm last night (no other Rescues had any room to take her in).

All the Rescues are struggling to take in unwanted cats. I am told that if your landlord uses section 21, and has sold the house you live in, you must find somewhere else to live; this is the reason for so many cats needing new homes. Most vacant properties have the same rule - No Pets. One cat here is seventeen years old, her owner has had her from a kitten, her landlord gave her notice that the house was sold and she had eight weeks to find alternative accommodation. She said every one she tried said No Pets. Time was running out; she had to take one she could afford. The poor old cat is missing her, wanting attention from everyone, its difficult rehoming a 17vear-old cat that is not fond of other cats.

All the latest cats have been neutered and spayed. Costa our Mobile Vet arrived with his travelling operating theatre and parked outside and did all the procedures. It was so convenient, we also asked him to trim the nails on a dog belonging a resident who lives in Nightingales.

Having a mobile Vet is good news, especially for pet owners who don't drive. Some cats and dogs hate going to the Vets. We had pets that suffered travel sickness, or had to have calming medications before going to the Vets, to help with the stress. In this heat if you own a tortoise never leave him out in the sun, their shells heat up so quickly their body overheats and swells, virtually cooking the Tortoise. They need some shade in your garden. If you have a rabbit or guinea-pig in your garden remember they have fur coats. Hutches are like ovens, so ensure they are in the shade, and their water bottles are filled daily.

Every day we have phone calls about birds falling out of nests -seagull babies running around, and injured pigeons. The best organisation to contact is Sompting Wildlife Rescue - they are so helpful. If you can, google them. Nerys usually sorts them out.


