From the Rectory

Happy New Year! The Church Year begins on Advent Sunday (this year 1st December!) but as this magazine is for 2 months, it also covers the new calendar year, from January. Looking back over 2024, it has been another busy year for the Parish, like any year with its ups and downs. Sadly, we've lost a number of our friends this past year, remembering each with gratitude for all they brought to our lives. I've met some lovely new residents in Findon too over this year as I walk Tilly, welcome to everyone new to one of our villages! On behalf of the church, I'd like to record our thanks too to Michael Drakeford, who steps down from his role as PCC Treasurer from January 2025, having worked so hard and so efficiently for many years in this voluntary but vital role. Thank you to David for joining our team in his place.

Advent is a time of preparation. Everyone is 'getting ready for Christmas', busily buying gifts for loved ones and preparing seasonal goodies to eat, but within the church the preparations go much deeper than this. Through Advent, in the 4 weeks before Christmas, we are encouraged to prepare our hearts to welcome the Christ child in once more, by prayerfully reflecting on our own thoughts and actions over the past year and seeking to deepen our commitment to our faith. In our churches there are no flower arrangements during Advent, just the Advent stand with candles and perhaps a little greenery. Each Sunday a new candle is lit, so as

Christmas approaches, there is a little more light each week, building up to the lighting of the 5th candle at the Mass of the Nativity (Midnight Mass) late on Christmas Eve as we joyfully celebrate the birth of Jesus, Light of the World.

Christmas decorations seem to go up earlier each year in our shops and homes, then many people take them down very soon after Christmas morning! In the church, the Christmas Season continues until the Feast of Candlemas (the Presentation of Christ in the Temple) on February 2nd so theoretically decorations could stay up till then - a great excuse for not dusting! 12th night is however traditionally when our trees are taken down, and that is long enough for most people. But what is left, once the decorations are packed away for another year? January can feel like a cold, dark, sad month... but as Christians, we continue to remember God's wonderful free gift of himself for us all in Jesus Christ. Born away from home in poverty more than 2000 years ago, growing up to teach us all of his Father's great love for all of creation, culminating in giving his life for us on the cross and rising again to show the world that for all who believe in him there is the promise of eternal life, this is what we remember and celebrate each Christmas.

Findon Parish News

As we move towards Christmas with Halloween and Guy Fawkes night behind us and the start of Xmas lights installation already underway, the focus of Findon Parish Council (FPC) turns to working on the Precept and budget for the 2025/2026 financial year, representing funds to maintain and enhance the village. This forms the overall budget for FPC for the financial year and is used for multiple purposes, including support for local groups and organisations within the village community, equipment and resources for keeping the village in good condition, and enables specific projects such as the regeneration of Nepcote Pond that occurred this year.

A number of groups that do support village life in Findon will have recently received a grant request form and we look forward to assessing these. FPC is keen to foster positive effects that benefit our village and welcome applicants to engage with the Council.

Many thanks are due to Findon Village WI who created an elegant and atmospheric tribute using poppies, around the lone soldier on Pond Green for Remembrance Day. During the service at St John the Baptist Church our local new MP, Beccy Cooper was represented by her father at the wreath laying. Beccy has expressed that she is keen to attend a future FPC meeting and, as our MP, listen and talk with residents. We will post the date

proposed and encourage attendance to cover questions and answers, for which we will create suitable time.

Across Findon we have numerous memorial benches carrying name plaques. FPC has undertaken an assessment and subsequently created a proposed maintenance plan, which has involved and will continue with our village Men In Sheds group. In addition a policy has been created regarding how memorial benches will be authorized in the future by FPC. Once approved, this policy will be placed on the FPC website. In a similar fashion the location of dog waste bins across the village, supporting our significant dog walker population whilst maintaining the village environment, has been mapped and will also be available for reference.

During the course of the year specific grant monies associated with house building are allocated to FPC by the South Downs National Park Authority. These grants are for specific purposes, such as local infrastructure, supporting health, or education. A specific team is tasked by FPC to scope these grants and propose projects that utilise these funds to village benefit. Results of this process should be available via our next article in Findon News.



Fndon Wildflower Group

The Findon Wildflower Group have now completed the preparation for rewilding the southern end of the High Street embankment and the grass bank at the top of Steep Lane.

At the top of Steep Lane: following a profusion of wildflowers in the summer, the group have removed an extensive area of turf to join the existing beds, and more wildflower seeds have been sown. The area on the left of the site path (looking north) has been left fallow to see what wildflowers emerge naturally.

On the High Street embankment: existing wildflower beds, which saw a lovely display of wildflowers in the summer, have been extended and sown with more wildflower seeds. This site is less suitable for growing large swathes of wildflowers because of the intermittent shade provided by the trees and because of the relative narrowness of the site. It will therefore require a slightly different approach. We aim to grow more lowgrowing wildflower plants and have planted a few hundred spring bulbs around and in between the trees, including Bluebells, Snowdrops, Wild Tulips, Crocuses, Nodding Star of Bethlehem and Lily of the Valley. In

the spring, plug and more mature wild flowering plants, will be planted elsewhere on the site.

Wildflowers prefer nutrient poor soil. Unfortunately, the soil on both sites is surprisingly good (as can be seen by the amount of vigorous grass growth!) so for the past year we have been raking and removing the cuttings from the two sites each time the grass has been cut by AC Gardens, to avoid further enrichment of the soil.

The plan is now to rewild these two sites which will entail the grass being cut twice a year; once in spring, before the wildflowers grow and once in the autumn to cut back the dead flowers. At each cut, the cuttings will be raked and removed. An important element of the seed mix we use is the addition of Yellow Rattle which attaches its roots to those of grass, drawing water and nutrients from them and supressing the grass growth – a pretty, useful little wildflower!

Findon Wildflower Group will maintain both sites which, if needed, include cutting growth which obstructs the footpaths and roads.

Rewilding and establishing wildflower sites take several years, and we will continue to monitor and review the success of the rewilding project which is sponsored by Findon Parish Council and the South Down National Park Trust who have also provided valuable advice and guidance for the project. Of course, there is no guarantee that the wildflowers will flourish and thrive, but we feel it important to try!

We are a small group of 9 volunteer village residents and are therefore somewhat limited in our scope for developing further wildflower sites in the village. We joined forces for our recent 'big dig' on both sites, with the Open Spaces Team which, was greatly appreciated. We would very

much welcome further volunteers to join our group. We meet as and when required for 2-3 hours at a time. If you are interested in joining our group or wish to enquire about anything to do with the project or indeed wildflowers, please contact Siân Keating via email: doders1@hotmail.co.uk.

In the meantime, we rather hope that we have a cold and frosty winter which are the perfect conditions to enable the seeds to germinate in spring and produce a beautiful profusion of wildflowers next summer.

After a Merry (and wintery) Christmas, let's hope for a Happy (and colourful) New Year!









We have the new heating control system running but we need help from the supplier to get the Hallmaster link working properly

This will be my last article as chair of the village hall trust as I am standing down at the AGM this year. I would like to thank all my fellow trustees, both past and present for the generous help and support they have offered me. At the time of writing the elections for the new committee have not yet been held but I would also like to offer my congratulations and best wishes to the new chair. The next major capital project for the new team will be the car park re-surfacing.

The new sound-proofing doors for the interconnecting doorway between the two halls are ready to fit and we have identified a contractor to do this work – by the time you read this they may be all finished and we hope that we will have a very acceptable level of noise isolation between the rooms.

This will now be activity managed by the Village Hall Trust rather than an independent activity that simply takes place in the village hall. The first of the "New Teams" lunches will take place at 12:45 on 28th January. As ever, there is always room for further volunteers! We think that both the Light Lunch and the Tea and Biscuits afternoons are important in that they help the Hall to reach villagers who don't otherwise use the hall very much - and it is there for everybody! Personally, I think a big thank you both to Dorothy and her team and another to the new team is richly deserved.

Lambs Tails is now an area where we need a significant boost and we are hopeful that we can achieve this – rather like we have for the Light Lunches. 

I asked their ages and have they had their Inoculations and does he have the Mum? It was such a very bad line! She said "They are babies and haven't had any inoculations and he doesn't have the Mum because he hatched the eggs out in an Incubator", then I fell in, she was talking about chickens!!! Not Kittens!

We still have lots of Cats, two Kittens, Rabbits, Guinea-Pigs, nine Hens, as well as the Donkey,

Pony, Parrot and a new Gerbil. All need cleaning out, grooming and feeding every day, A lovely

friendly Norwegian Forest Cat has just arrived. The owner has moved into a flat and Pepsi the cat is missing a garden to roam in. Our elderly resident Dogs were so upset when somebody very close was letting bangers off one evening. One dog Bruno couldn't stop shaking on my lap all evening then had Diarrhoea all over my kitchen floor for two nights running. Bluey the other dog was being sick over and over in his bed. All the Hens stopped laying. We haven't had one egg since that dreadful night.


