From the Rectory

Another Church year has passed and in a few weeks we will once again remember the humble birth of a baby in an obscure location more than 2000 years ago, a baby who would grow up to change the world in his short life, a life which is the foundation of our Christian faith. Prophets had foretold of the coming of a Saviour over many centuries - you can read about this across the Old Testament - but when Jesus was born, the first people to hear about it were shepherds on a hillside. Jesus Christ, Emmanuel (God with us) slipped into the world just like you and me, a world under foreign occupation and oppression as are parts of our world today, his birth announced by angels (God's messengers) to a few very ordinary people, born not in a palace, but in an animal shelter, because all the inns were full.

Almighty God became human as Jesus, yet also as God's Son, fully divine, come to teach humanity to love and respect one another instead of abusing power and perpetuating hatred, but sadly most people failed to listen then and still don't listen today. Jesus grew up to bring God's healing and forgiveness to all who turn to him in faith, and through his death and resurrection revealing the path to eternal life.

So, as you prepare to celebrate Christmas, in whatever way you are accustomed to, remember that it is the birth of Jesus, Son of the Living God, trappings that seem to grow earlier and larger, more expensive, every year. The gifts we give and receive are (or should be) a token of the love and respect we have for one another, but the greatest gift of all came all those years ago, laid in a manger because there was no room in the inn. The last verse of the carol 'In the bleak midwinter' asks and answers the perennial seasonal problem - What can I give him? All that Jesus asks of you and of me, this and every Christmas, is to 'give our heart'. This costs nothing financially, but can feel costly as we seek to become less selfcentred and more focussed on Jesus. following his example and teaching. This is the last time I will write From the Rectory, as I retire at the beginning of January. My body tells me it is time, but my heart longs to continue as your Vicar. The 13+ years I have served here in the Parish of Findon, Clapham and Patching have been a joy and I feel truly blessed to have been called here. I will continue to hold you all in my prayers this Christmastide and on into the new year, I thank you for making me and my family so welcome, for your friendship and all the support and encouragement you have given me in my time as the Parish Priest and wish you a happy Christmas, a peaceful and fulfilling new year and every blessing for the future.








Poppies

We hope everyone will come and join us for the festivities, including mince pies, mulled wine and carols.



Testing emergency response - Exercise Dogwood in Findon

On a sunny autumn day, Findon village became the scene of a dramatic emergency simulation known as Exercise Dogwood - a carefully staged event designed to test the readiness and coordination of local emergency response teams.

The scenario - an unexploded bomb was discovered in the heart of the village, prompting the evacuation to Findon Village Hall of 20 residents, played by volunteers from the village. With no time to gather belongings, evacuees arrived with nothing, simulating the real-life urgency and unpredictability of such emergencies. Each participant was given a detailed profile, outlining specific needs such as medical conditions, children's requirements and the need for clothing and blankets adding realism and urgency to the exercise.

Findon Village Hall Trustees opened the hall as a rest centre and did a great job of supporting the evacuees until other agencies arrived. The village hall proved to be an ideal location for a rest centre, offering excellent facilities including accessible toilets and well-equipped kitchens. Teas, coffees and light snacks were provided, by the Trustees, to attendees upon arrival.

Food requirements were carefully recorded to accommodate dietary needs such as diabetic, vegan and vegetarian preferences. This ensured that, should the situation require hot food to be ordered in, appropriate options could be sourced.

Contingency plans were in place for extended stays. If the duration had increased, staff were prepared to

assemble makeshift beds to ensure comfort and rest for those affected.

The operation was led by Arun District Council's Emergency Planning Officer, supported by a dedicated team from West Sussex County Council (WSCC), Arun District Council rest centre staff, Findon Village Hall trustees, and the British Red Cross. Together, they created a fully functioning rest centre, recording evacuee details, assessing needs, and providing essential support, both practical and emotional.

The Trustees ensured that the evacuees were provided with shelter and refreshments whilst they waited for the other agencies to arrive.

The Red Cross played a vital role, offering, wash bags, blankets, and emotional support, ensuring comfort and care for all involved.

Officers from WSCC Resilience and Emergency Team were able to offer the support of the counties Social Services and had transport on standby if required.

Arun District Council Officers swapped their normal day jobs to work as rest centre staff, providing compassionate support to the evacuees.

The volunteers from the village who did a great job of playing the part of evacuees made the whole thing feel realistic.

Throughout the exercise, the rest centre manager provided regular updates, including advising the bomb disposal squad had arrived at the scene and when evacuees could return home.

After approximately three hours, the allclear was given and the evacuees were

portraying evacuees were fantastic, bringing authenticity and emotion to the scenario. For the emergency teams and the Trustees, it was an invaluable opportunity to test procedures, identify gaps, and strengthen collaboration across agencies.

Events like Dogwood are essential in ensuring that,

should a real emergency occur, our communities are prepared, protected, and supported. A huge thank you to all who participated and supported this valuable initiative."

Findon Friends



Paws Animal Sanctuary

Lots of phone calls from pet owners planning to go away for Christmas asking can I look after their animals? In the past when I had a lot more volunteers I would usually agree. Now we have cold miserable mornings with volunteers who have loyally worked here for years and years. We are all finding the hard work taking its toll. We all have aches and pains, bad backs, some have even been forced to retire or can no longer drive. Many of our young volunteers from Plumpton or Brinsbury Colleges who during the week come to do work experience one day a week leave at the end of term to find work or go to universities. We still have such busy days with lots of animals. It is hard work cleaning out the hutches, pens, cages, stables every morning, grooming and feeding the animals. Lifting sacks of cat litter, animal food, bales of hay, and vegetables.

We are lucky to be working mainly inside and only the horse /donkey and poultry are outside. In the evenings we start to put the animals to bed earlier when the clocks go back because it is

dark by 4.30pm. We have volunteers who have a problem finding somewhere to park here in the evenings. The chickens put themselves to bed as soon as it gets dark.

If anyone needs an Animal Ambulance for any reason (not everyone has a car), you can get help from a service in Findon Village called Pets2Vets.


