I hope you all had a healthy and happy Christmas and would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who helped make our Christmas celebrations this year so successful. There are some photos from the Findon Live Nativity and family film afternoon on our website – why not have a look if you haven't seen them already? While you're there, check out all the extra things we have planned so far for the coming year.

2025 is a special year for Chichester Diocese too, as we celebrate the 950<sup>th</sup> birthday of our cathedral with many exciting events planned across the Diocese for all ages. Details can be found on the Diocesan website, or you can follow the link on our own website. Each Deanery is hosting a celebratory Service, led by one of our Bishops, and ours takes place at 7.30pm in St Mary's Church Broadwater on

Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> February, led by Bishop Ruth, Bishop of Horsham. Everyone is welcome, and some of our own congregation are taking an active part, so do come along to support them if you can. If a lift is needed, contact the Parish Office and we will try to help.

This year is also the 1700<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Nicene Creed, the Statement of Faith initially agreed at the Council of Nicaea all those years ago, to combat heresy and provide a common ground for the faith of all Christians, believing in one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This faith is affirmed every Sunday in our Services, and also at every baptism as we welcome new Christians, whatever their age, into the fellowship of Christ's family.

The Diocese has prepared a Lent Course based on the Nicene Creed for this year and there will be the opportunity to join a daytime or evening group in the Parish using this material, with contributions from a different historical Spiritual figure each week of the course, available as a podcast or in the leaflet called 'I Believe', available to download from the Diocesan website. Just type in Diocese of Chichester Homepage and follow the links! Lent begins on Ash

Wednesday, March 5<sup>th</sup>, and our Groups will start the following week (day and time tbc depending on takeup) Our now established Monday evening Homegroup will also be following this course.

Our March Messy Church session falls on Shrove Tuesday, so the theme will obviously be Lent and pancake based! We would like to invite you to join us for a pancake towards the end of the session should you wish to, or any time to see what we get up to with our families in the Chanctonbury Hall on the first Tuesday of the month 3.30-5.45pm. #### Men in Sheds



#### Why practise Chair Yoga?

Chair yoga is ideal for people who have restricted movement due to ageing, injury or disability.

Yoga is a practise for everyone and in classes we use a host of modifications, one being the chair, yoga straps, blocks, balls and scarves, to take us into postures. The postures are adapted for people who have difficulty getting up and down from the floor.

As we age mobility declines; when we are injured, we have to find new ways to practice. Chair yoga can help with conditions such as high blood pressure, anxiety, chronic fatigue, depression and chronic pain. If you have joint replacements chair yoga will help you to get moving again safely, by building strength in the muscles that support the new joint. As we get older our ability to balance decreases and this can lead to falls. Chair yoga helps strengthen leg muscles and works on balance postures, to prevent these falls and keep you independent for longer.

The class starts with finding your natural alignment, then moves on to

breathing techniques to encourage relaxation and movement of energy. We then move onto the posture work limbering all the joints in the body, and moving the spine in all its natural directions. You will learn short sequences which help keep the brain alert and exercises that raise your heart rate which are beneficial to a healthy heart.

At the end of the session we have a relaxation or guided meditation. And then it's time for tea and biscuits as we get to know others in our community. The classes are always fun and students really look forward to this special time in their week.

I hope everyone enjoyed Christmas. Luckily, we had re-homed almost all the cats and kittens and guinea-pigs during autumn, allowing most of the volunteers to have a few days off during the holiday. Then we had many volunteers phoning to say they were really ill. We had to cope with just a couple of us. We have been going round with cloths, disinfecting everything, wearing rubber gloves; as if it is Covid all over again.

We still have lots of resident animals to care for. Elvis the pony rolls in the snow and loves it and gallops around. Elvis the donkey hates it and sulks in the field shelter, you only see his nose. The hens don't mind the snow, but they hate the rain and disappear inside in the dry at the first drop.

We were asked to take four cats from a house in Brighton because the owner has died. David from Billy Bears Cat Rescue offered to pick the cats up, but the snow was so bad in Brighton David got stuck behind a big traffic jam, then the roads were closed and he had to turn back. Barrie our early morning volunteer was out spreading sacks of salt\grit on all our paths to stop Volunteers slipping over, we were well prepared for snow.

A local vet had a stray cat that was left with them because of the cold weather. I said they could bring it in, it was microchipped but the records were three years out of date. So we know the cat's name and microchip number but not the current owner. The previous owner said she gave the cat away three years ago when she moved and got a job travelling around. We will try to trace the current owner with a photograph posted on facebook. He is a such beautiful, very friendly boy. We also have two white cats coming in. They were a Mum and four kittens dumped in a car wash in Birmingham, visitors rescued them and brought them home (two kittens rehomed), Mum is staying, so two left to be rehomed. They are flea'd, wormed, neutered and spayed, inoculated and microchipped ready for new homes.

Sadly, our oldest resident cat Google died of old age on my lap couple of days after Christmas. She stopped eating and just sat next to a radiator in her bed, with the rabbit next to her. We all miss her, especially the rabbit. The parrot keeps calling out "Google".

We are very grateful to all our members, supporters and friends who kindly sent Christmas cards containing donations at Christmas. We no longer attend fetes, markets or jumble sales with our stalls, because the pitches cost too much and if it rains all day we don't take any money, and you have to book in advance. Hopefully in the future we will raise funds by selling our PAWS Animals Rhyming Poetry Book. It's still not ready as we are still choosing the drawings to go with the poems. I hope it will be ready soon, so watch this space. Stay indoors, keep warm, it will soon be Spring.
