



From the Rectory

Autumn is here, leaves in a kaleidoscope of colours are tumbling around me as I walk the dog, the sun on my back as warm as on any summer's day, but the days are getting shorter. The first half term of a new school year is over and the shops are bursting with Christmas goods to tempt us, even though we have 4 more weeks until Advent (the time of preparation for the Christmas miracle) begins. The end of October into early November is a time of remembering in the church calendar and the period between the Feasts of All Saints and All Souls and the Feast of Christ the King is often called Kingdom Season. In churches using vestments, the colour of the Priest's stole and chasuble and of church altar frontals and cloths changes to red for the four weeks of November in these final weeks of the Church's year.

The Feast of All Saints is 1st November, but kept by the church on the nearest Sunday, so this year on 3rd. We remember with thanksgiving those holy people whose lives have followed the pattern of loving service and humility set by Christ and serve as an example to us today. The following day, November 2nd is All Souls Day, which we keep in the afternoon on the nearest Sunday, giving thanks for all our departed loved ones at a reflective act of worship in Findon Church. The secular consumer-led celebration of Halloween has its roots in All Hallows Eve, which was traditionally a jolly country festival of songs, stories and mummers plays before the seriousness of All Saints and All Souls on the following days. Sadly, the

American influence has spread over here with 'Trick or Treat'ing upsetting some elderly folk living alone and potentially also putting our youngsters at risk as they go unsupervised from door to door. The decorations using pumpkins (originally carved to keep 'bad spirits' away from the home) have grown to include plastic skeletons and spiders that add to our imprint on the natural world in our household refuse. Whilst I am all for children having fun, this is one custom that appears to have got out of hand!

The final part of this season of remembering comes on the Sunday closest to November 11th, Remembrance Sunday, when the busy world is hushed for 2 minutes as we stand in silence for 2 minutes to remember all those who have lost their lives, or had their lives drastically changed, through the ravages of war. We will gather at the end of our worship in Findon Church at the War Memorial outside at 11am, as we remember how the 1st World War ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month 1919 (Armistice Day) Traditionally, signalled by the firing of the Noon Gun on Signal Hill, one minute was a time of thanksgiving for those who had returned alive, the second minute was to remember the fallen. Poppy wreaths are laid at War Memorials across the country and overseas to remember those who have died fighting for our freedom in the two World Wars and subsequent conflicts. The poppy was chosen for its bright red colour, reflecting the poppies growing on Flanders





Findon Parish Council (FPC) has invested in further defibrillators, bringing coverage to six units which are sited at strategic points across the village and will be identified by locations available on the FPC website. It is the intent of FPC to run training in the operation of these life saving devices at Findon Village Hall for all interested residents at a date to be identified. We would be interested in hearing from any residents that have had cause to utilise such equipment, as a means to bring reality to our training and awareness, please write to us with your experiences and we would be delighted if you could attend and support the training.

In a similar fashion a more prosaic but relevant trend; the provision of dog-bins across the village continues to grow, with a further seven on order, when set up these locations will also be detailed on the FPC website.

The continued provision of appropriate equipment, clothing and risk assessment for our Open Spaces, Litter Picking and Wildflower Working Parties has underscored the need for greater

storage space to support these terrific volunteer initiatives. We have thereby funded further storage space close by our current location, to be erected in the coming weeks. Response to these volunteer initiatives is now sufficiently strong to consider additional days and in particular days where those unavailable mid-week can contribute to the positive environment we all cherish. At the recent October FPC meeting, West Sussex County Council (WSCC) Cllr Deborah Urquhart updated Councillors and members of the public on the conclusion of the latest West Sussex Fire Risk Assessment, Cllr Urguhart was pleased to report that nil aspects of the Assessment required improvement. Improvements at West Sussex Fire & Rescue Service highlighted in latest HMICFRS report -West Sussex County Council Cllr Urguhart also made reference the success of the Re-Use Shop in Billingshurst which could provide grant funding for initiatives such as local Repair Shops. My visit to Cinnamon Trust HQ in Hayle was really interesting and it was good to meet the team. John, Rosie and myself were made very welcome and came home with lots of lovely items from Christmas Catalogue to sell at the Fair. We also had a wonderful visit to Poldarves Sanctuary where the lovely pets who are too old or poorly to be rehomed live. It is an amazing place and the carers are all so dedicated and kind. The pets live as if they are in their own homes. One house is for dogs and another for cats. There is not a cage to be seen! One old dog with arthritis was being massaged when we arrived. Lying back on the therapist's lap on a beanbag with an expression of sheer bliss on his face! Other pets like horses, chickens and even a pig have

We saw one lovely old dog who had only one eye as the other had been cancerous and had to be removed. He is doing really well but he is an example of why fundraising is so vital to pay vets' bills. So the tea and biscuits afternoons on Mondays have restarted and we had a good turnout for the first one last week, we expect the numbers to grow as people remember it is up and running again.

We have the new heating control system running but still have some teething troubles, eventually, hirers will be able to book their own preferred temperature and the hall will then target that temperature before the booking starts, dropping the temperature again as the booking ends.

We have the Trust Annual General Meeting in November which includes elections to all the functional positions. This will take place at 8:00pm on the 28th of November in Chanctonbury Hall as usual all are welcome.

As mentioned last month, the work on the toilets in Chanctonbury has been completed with just a couple of minor snags to be sorted out and we are very happy with the new all tiled floors. We hope our hirers share our satisfaction and that it will be many years before these floors require any further attention. We have procured the new sound-proofing doors for the interconnecting doorway between the two halls and we are ready to progress

with this work - but we have realised that fitting such weighty doors is beyond our maintenance team and we will seek expert help in fitting them. It is now over a year since we opened Nepcote Hall and we said at the time that we were having to set our pricing structure on the basis of estimated running costs and usage levels. We now have that year's data to work with and are in the process of re-evaluating that balance between running costs and income. Note that costs such as the soundproofing, toilets repairs etc do not come out of income from hirers but primarily from fund raising, donations, grants and whatever other means we can find. This helps us keep hire charges low. Nevertheless, we are likely to be announcing a very modest increase in hire charges in the coming weeks and we hope these will then stable for a reasonable period.

We have had an excellent response with respect to volunteers for the events team – although we could still use a few more – events@findonvillagehall.net for those that are interested. However, we still need more for the gardens and maintenance teams chair@findonvillagehall.net





Repairs to St John the Baptist Church Spire Simon Knights

On Monday 23rd of September, after months of planning, Wallbridge the Wiltshire Steeplejacks came to fix the leaks on our Spire roof. It is made up of hundreds of cedar shingles, overlapping each other tightly, and due to the activity of local woodpeckers, it had over 30 holes in it, letting in rain and making the walls of the ringing chamber damp and humid. They tap the shingles to make the flies that hide underneath them come out, so they can eat them, but in the process, split some of them, and make holes several inches across, right through them.

David and his team came down, and using a very nifty caterpillar track cherry picker, which fitted through our Lychgate, started the repairs. They roped the top of the spire, added a ladder, and used ropes to move up and down the spire to reach all the holes and restore the roof integrity which is now drying out. The lighter shingles used to repair will dull down fairly quickly and blend in with the rest of them. The tower is already drying out and hopefully the woodpeckers will give it a rest for a while.

Findon Swimming Pool

As many will know our Swimming Pool has been undergoing restoration and urgent repairs after being closed for an extended period during and after the Covid crisis. There was the need to raise a lot of money to provide essential items, fabric, plant and other equipment including a new lining for the pool, an Air Source Heat Pump to replace the original heating systems, and works to all the pool buildings. Following on from this a great deal of hard work was needed to get the pool to the point where the council could sign it off for use by the public.

All swimming pools however big or small have to meet the same exacting standards, meaning that our little pool is treated the same as a larger municipal pool; it must be maintained, chemically treated and heated to the same extent; supervision by trained personnel during pool opening must also be in place for every session.

Whilst work had to continue apace all through the summer the pool was able to open at the end of the holidays and for the period of good weather that prevailed in early September. The committee were inundated with enquiries for private hire which bodes well for next year's season.

All of us at school - pupils, parents, staff and governors - would like to thank sincerely everyone who has brought about the return of this wonderful community facility. The committee, headed up by Chairman Mick Dicker, have done an incredible job, overseeing this work, conducting a lot of the tasks themselves and appointing excellent (and generous) contractors, many of whom have gone the extra mile to get everything ship-shape.

Everyone concerned is also very grateful to all of the kind donors who have contributed thousands of pounds to pay for the fabric and equipment. We have benefited from the generosity of local businesses and kind individuals who have made considerable donations to the cause.

Thank you again to everyone involved in the restoration of this wonderful amenity.

Hedgehogs running off leaving their babies; we take in so many babies

This year we had all the trees and bushes pruned early before the nesting season. That's a big mistake because with all the rain we had, all the trees have grown so high we are having to get them all pruned again. We have a grapevine and this year it was unbelievable, with so many bunches of grapes; everyone commented on it. Then the birds ate every single bunch of grapes before they had time to ripen.

All the cat pens are full, Costa our Mobile Vet "VetsCarePets" has been so busy worming, treating for fleas, neutering and spaying, inoculating all the cats and kittens. He parks his Mobile Operating Theatre outside, it is so convenient for us. I'm hoping we don't have a harsh winter. Last year the hay was rationed, as there was an early shortage of hay.

Jasper our donkey and Elvis our pony were both sun bathing today; lying in the




sunshine, out in the paddock. I hope we have more days like this before winter sets in...


