It was a pleasure to see all the hard work by the Findon Sheep Fair Committee come to fruition and result in such an outstanding event, with strong attendance and, this year, blessed by pleasant weather.

Many thanks should also go to all those volunteers who worked tirelessly throughout the day to deliver an event that rightly continues to attract so many compliments by visitors and media alike.

The application to South Downs National Park Authority for our bund on the North Verge continues to progress and it has been encouraging to see and hear of the increasing number of comments supporting the application. This measure is to ensure that the whole of Nepcote Green, now a conservation area, is robustly protected from further ingress and damage and fully in keeping with the landscape characteristics of this area. FPC took the decision to leave the duckweed covering on Nepcote Pond in place, simply explaining the nature of this coverage and its natural but temporary nature. Our expert advice indicates that this coverage should dissipate later this year and although it may return next year

A Tribute to Anne Brooks (from Helena)

With sadness, although most people will already know, Anne died early on the morning of 19th August, peacefully in Pentland Nursing Home just too late to make an announcement in the busy September Findon News.

Anne often said she was born in Findon, although actually she was born in Worthing, but she did spend much of her early life in the village, her maternal grandparents living in Maxwells on the A24 on the Village/Valley border. She and her mother stayed there for the war years, their home in Portsmouth feeling too dangerous as a naval base. After a career in the Civil Service, specialising in Welfare Support for many years, Anne retired to 34 Cross Lane and immediately joined the church here, as well as many other village organisations, including taking a leading role in the afternoon WI. Her organisational skills were put to good use in so many village clubs and organisations over the years and she was a valued member of the church Council and served as Churchwarden for a period.

Anne was always ready to support and help anyone, with sound advice on how to access extra support from outside agencies if needed. She had a deep personal faith and was always ready to learn more. Study Groups were often held at her home, allowing Julie to take part easily. They both thoroughly enjoyed Messy Church! Anne married late in life and was a great support to Julie, especially when Tom, Julie's father, died suddenly, caring for her and encouraging her to join in with many different activities, especially her singing which Julie loved! Anne's fear as she grew older was that she would die before Julie but thankfully this did not happen. However, after Julie had gone, Anne's own health rapidly declined. After a period in and out of hospital following falls, Anne reluctantly moved into a Care Home. After a couple of moves, Anne was happy in Pentlands, where the staff loved her stories!

Anne loved nature, keeping part of her back garden natural to encourage wildlife and always topping up her bird feeders. Watching her birds brought her joy as her mobility decreased and she spent more time in her armchair. Anne was so sad when her cats died, but was comforted by visits from her 'doggy friends' – there were always treats in the side pocket of her chair, and didn't the dogs know it! I knew the end was near when Chris and I visited her with Tilly and she didn't recognise a dog was there. She died 3 days later.

Personally, I will miss her friendship and the wonderful theological discussions we had together almost to the end of Anne's life. May she rest in peace and rise in glory.

Findon Sheep Fair 2024

This years Findon Sheep fair proved a great success. The weather was kind to us and with the sun shining crowds once again flocked to the show to enjoy the broad number of attractions on show. Over the course of the event we estimate that 8,000 people took part in the show.

The show that has its roots in a 750 year old charter for a fair and for 250 years has involved auctioning and showing sheep. Standing true to this history this years event involved 35 farms showing 233 sheep, a demonstration of the art of sheep shearing and spinning of wool, we also held a 'mock auction' of sheep and once again also welcomed back the very popular 'dancing sheep'. This years Supreme champion was Amy Howard with her Kerry Hill from North Chapel West Sussex

Wider events at the show included; 'Birds of Prey', Morris dancing, the Farmyard circus, Children' Circus skills, Punch and Judy, Nicola Miles dancing studio, Harris's Fairground, the ever popular tractor ride, vintage car display, pony rides and bee keepers. Several educative pitches were also provided including the history of Findon, south downs national park and Brinsbury college. In addition several local charities were able to raise funds by running stalls.

Across the course of the weekend we also held the ever popular evening barn dance, the Saturday night band and closed the festival with the Salvation Army Band Sunday service – these were all well attended and provided further opportunities to celebrate. None of the above would be possible without the fantastic support we received from; local business, landowners, the Findon valley Scouts who manage the traffic, our sponsors, our suppliers, the Parish Council and villagers. We would like to thank all of these and also extend our gratitude to the army of volunteers who comprise 136 people giving freely of their time to allow the show to run. They all work tirelessly from Thursday to Sunday setting up , manning and clearing up after the show and we are truly grateful for this overwhelming support.

We hope that you were able to participate in and enjoy the show. Our planning now starts for 2025! Tree Group Update

The tree group has been very active over the last year, we have planted about 150 saplings around the village including a new hedge at the village hall. Caring for young trees already planted is important work, weeding and watering are essential for getting them established. This year has been cool and wet, not good for holidays but great for tree growth!

We have a small tree nursery beside the basketball court near the village hall and at present around 100 saplings lined out. Most trees planted in the last 5 years have been on Parish Council owned land and we are now looking for fresh sites in the village. If you have a space on your property, garden, boundary or odd corner where a tree could go then I might be able to supply it. There are Oak, Rowan, Birch, Willow and a number of shrubs, Dogwood, Hazel and Viburnum lantana (Wayfaring tree) available.

On the whole the tree cover in Findon remains good. Ash Dieback has caused a lot of deaths but is currently not affecting all Ash with isolated good size trees still growing well – for the time being at least!

Wasn't the Sheep Fair great this year – loads of visitors, perfect weather, and so much to see. The culmination of a true village effort, showcasing Findon at its best. The shop stall did an excellent trade; our sausage rolls and pastries were very popular, as was our wonderful coffee machine. Thank you to all those volunteers who served, and to all who visited our stall.

I promised to let you know the results of the survey we asked you to help with a few months ago. The results were overwhelmingly positive, confirming what an asset to the village the shop is, with great opening hours (Mon-Sat 7am-7pm) and Sun (7am -12pm). A number of you asked that we advertise the PO's services more, so, over the coming months, I'll be drip feeding that to you. If I did it all now, you might lose the will to live, which would be unfortunate. It particularly wouldn't look good on my cv.

For starters, the PO is open fantastic hours – Mon – Fri 8.30am – 5.30pm, Sat 8.30am – 5pm and Sun 8.30am – 12pm. Where else offers a service like that? You can withdraw cash - much safer and friendlier than a cash machine - and, you can take out odd amounts rather than being restricted to multiples of £10. I'll definitely be using that service – probably on a Saturday afternoon or Sunday morning! You can deposit cheques, which is handy, especially if, like me, you cannot get the bank to accept your photo of it when you try to use online banking. You can also deposit cash, and we can supply money bags. Pretty please we would appreciate it if you could pay

cash into an account rather than exchanging it for notes.

The PO holds Euros in stock, so you can buy them instantly, whilst we can get other currencies for the next working day if you request them before midday. Or, there's a Travel Money card, but more about that next time.

As a community shop, we want to support projects in Findon as much as possible. We have been very pleased to be able to purchase the entire wish list of 80 books chosen by the children of St John's School, for their library. The school is thrilled, as are we.

On the subject of giving, I'd like to thank everyone who has brought empty egg boxes back to the shop in the past to help our supplier. Sadly, we are no longer able to return them for various reasons, so, please, no more egg boxes!

Finally, I have some important news to tell you. The price of First-Class stamps is going up again on 7th October – this time by 30p. The second rise this year, and we are not happy about it. So, we are warning you of their plans, so that you have a chance to get yourself to the PO before that date and stock up. No time to waste!

Findon Relief in Sickness Fund - Charity No. 255478

Unfamiliar to many, this fund was set up by the District Nursing Association specifically for residents of Findon Parish and has been running since at least 1971. The aim of the fund is to support local residents when they are sick, convalescent, disabled or infirm. The fund can be used to provide or pay for items, services or facilities that will help people feel better or help them to recover.

With the amazing support of Sally, the event was held at The Gun on 31st August. Hosting a variety of local stall holders, activities for young and old and a fantastic raffle - with all locally donated prizes.

Katie proposed a target of £1000 to raise, but being the first event of its kind, none of the ladies knew how successful it would be. The weather was kind, and as the event opened at 12pm, crowds of villagers and others from afar came to support. The event wasn't just busy, it thrived! And with a lot of hard work, donations and support, the ladies managed to pull off a very successful first event!

The Fabulous Findon Ladies raised an outstanding £1880 in just one afternoon. And both Katie and Maxine want to offer a heartfelt thank you to each and every person who helped, donated, and supported the event. The funds were split between the two very grateful charities and are already making a difference.



St John the Baptist CE School Findon

Just like every other school in the country our local primary has a Governing body that oversees the running of everything to do with our children's education and welfare. We have a governing board comprising of staff, parents and representatives from various parts of our local and church communities.

To help administer this we are looking to employ a (very) part time CLERK TO GOVERNORS to work on a casual contract, for a few hours during term time only. There is a small salary starting at £12.18 per hour (currently under review) but usually clerks undertake this role as much for the enjoyment of the role and a desire to be a part of something very interesting that is integral to our community.

We are looking to appoint a Clerk to Governors with outstanding personal, organisational and skills (and with sufficient computing ability). Hours per week will be variable, approx. 80 hours per academic year, as they are reliant on the number of meetings arranged and any additional related work required.

The post involves record keeping, preparation of and circulating agendas and associated paperwork, attending meetings and taking minutes, liaising with Governors and working with the Chair in managing the smooth and efficient running of the Governing Body. Part of the position involves learning about governance and being able to answer questions for the governing body on governance. Therefore full training will be given. We would need the successful candidate to:

• Have strong organisational and administrative skills

• Have experience of taking minutes at meetings, assimilating key information and preparing letters

• Have good ICT skills, including Microsoft Word and Excel

• Possess good basic literacy and numeracy skills (to GCSE level or above)

• Have excellent interpersonal skills and be keen to work as part of a team

• Maintain Confidentiality

• Advise the Governing Body on constitutional matters and ensure the continuity of Governing Body business.

I hope everybody enjoyed this year's Findon Sheep Fair as much as I did. So much more to enjoy and see this year, it was very exhausting following the crowds. But what a nice change this year being able to find somewhere to sit, the bales of straw were such a good idea, everyone agreed a very welcome discovery for tired feet. I love the fudge stall, I always look for that. I wasn't disappointed, always so many flavours to choose from. I chose Apple, Ginger, and Rum and Raisin. What a treat, made my day.

I couldn't resist buying two scarves, one with cats on, the other with bees, from a lovely stall selling animal goods. I also bought a beautifully illustrated children's book about the Findon Sheep Fair called "George Goes to Findon", By Mollie Tomalin (publ.BCFC). I kept meeting so many friends and people I knew, all with happy smiling faces. What a lovely day out it was.

My feet really suffered that evening, putting animals to bed for the night.

We were asked to take in a very frightened stray tom cat. Alas, trying to catch him resulted in the poor lady who had been feeding him for ages being bitten, having to go to A&E for treatment, and a Tetanus injection.

Our Volunteer David from Billy Bear's Rescue had volunteered to help catch him to bring him in. He also received a nasty bite. We were told the cat was limping and had a problem eating.

The vet came in, after putting the cat in a carrying cage realised he was in pain and gave him a pain relief injection and a course of antibiotics. We put the crushed pills in scrambled eggs and chicken every day. One of our volunteers (our cat whisperer) Ara has been visiting the cat, now named Steve every day. He hid at first, hissing at anyone going near his pen, eventually coming out for Ara when she sat on the floor talking to him. Each day he improved, he stopped hissing.




